Molly Loneman keeps an eye on her 3-year-old triplets, Julia, Halle, and Clay. She and her husband also have a 6-year-old daughter and a little, green kit to help keep track of it all. "We were just interested in organizing our home after the triplets and we were interested in something that would get it all in one place." So they got the kit and the book that comes with it called, "If Something Happens To Me." "Life gets so chaotic and you start to think, what if something happened, what would I do?" said Molly.

It was the brainchild of two Omaha men. "It just gives your family a starting point to go from. It takes all your most important information and places it in one place," said estate planning attorney Niel Nielsen. "They are only useful if you have them when you need them and a lot of times in your life you need those documents at painful or stressful times," said financial planner Joe Hearn. "So you need your will after you've lost somebody you love. You need your power of attorney when someone is in the emergency room and doctors want to know who has the authority to act for this person."

It was only when the Loneman family started looking for the pieces that they realized how spread out they had become. "It was all scattered at different parts of the home and at the bank and at work," said Molly. Now they are pulling the documents together. "It's a great way to feel secure about where everything is."


